- ◆ Set goals.
- ◆ Develop a vision, mission statement, and theme.
- ◆ Appoint committee chairpersons and committees or project chairpersons.
- ◆ Use an agenda and make your meetings interesting and keep them moving.
- ◆ Have interesting programs.
- ◆ Delegate, recognize, and reward.
- ◆ Be an active participant in the District Governor's Advisory Committee.
- ◆ Share and communicate.
- ◆ Encourage club members to attend zone meetings, district conferences, state convention, West Virginia Lions Leadership School, and visit other clubs.
- ◆ Hold regularly scheduled orientation sessions for new members.

Although you may feel it is too late to start implementing these actions as your term is half over, it certainly isn't too late to review your accomplishments as well as your goals. You still have time to involve all of the members in your club. Communicating the assignment of committees offers the opportunity to motivate and rotate assignments to keep everyone interested, and involved. This lets you re-enforce the importance of every member and that every member can contribute to our motto "**We Serve**". Assigning new members on committees with experienced Lions can help prevent members from becoming over burdened by serving on the same committee year after year. Remember, new members bring in new members and new members bring new ideas.

The Five Steps to Becoming an Effective Club Secretary are:

- ◆ Prepare and file required reports timely.
- ◆ Share and communicate.
- ◆ Keep accurate and up-to-date club and membership records.
- ◆ Maintain an ample supply of club supplies.
- ◆ Be an active participate in the District Governor's Advisory Committee.

Utilizing all of the above steps and adding new members will insure that your club will qualify for the Club Excellence Program. Treating members like family and keeping everyone involved will achieve both gaining new members and retaining our present members.

Remember Dr. Tam's Theme "*I Believe*" ... "*He Believes*:"

That one person can make a difference.

That the entire world can be changed when we come together as Lions.

That changing a life – or the world – starts with each one of us.

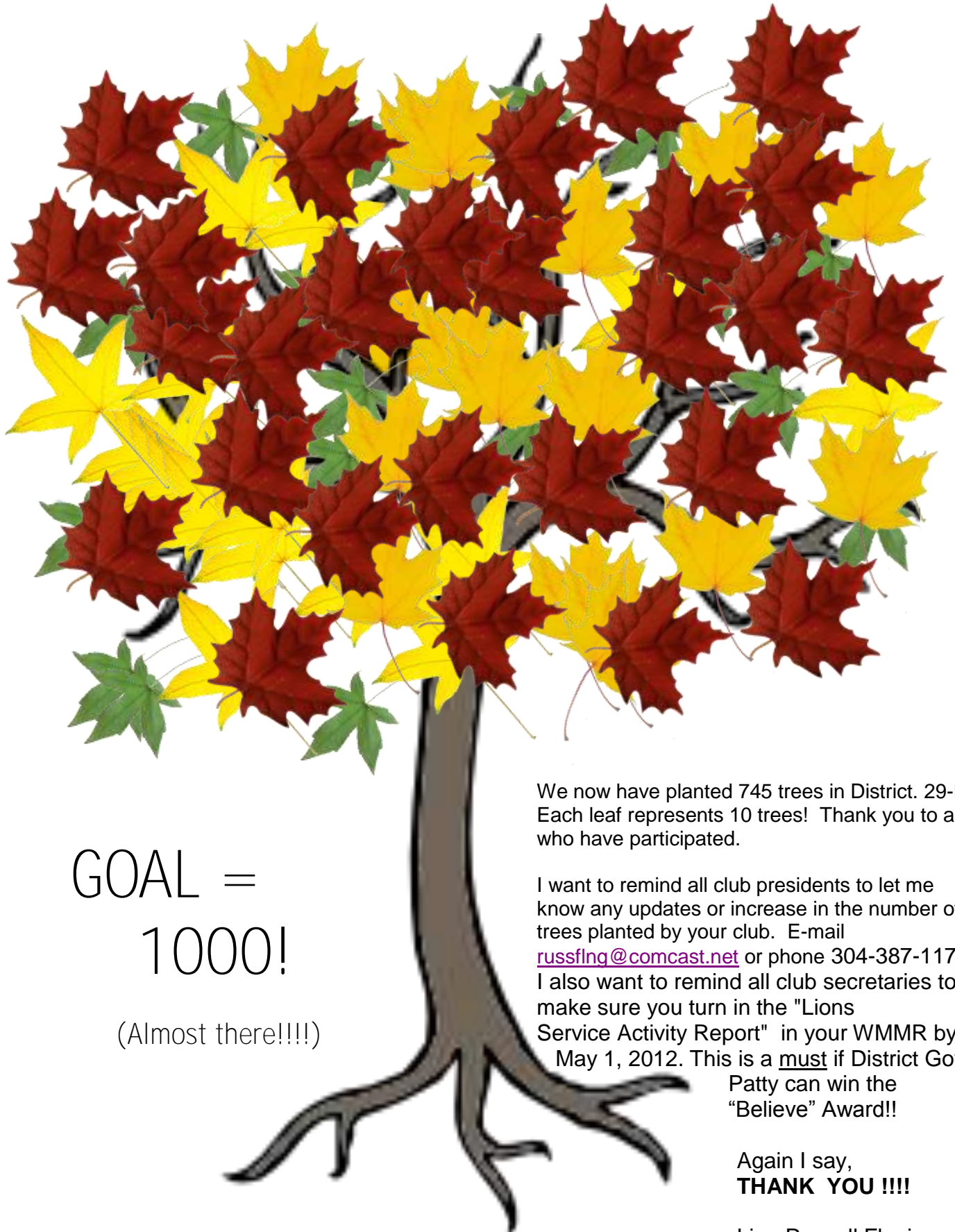
