This month, I would like to point out the resources that are available to all Lions on the Lions Clubs International Web site. In the last few years, the Web site has become the go-to place to find Lions information, forms, brochures and more. In addition to on-line reporting now done by many club secretaries,

there is a wealth of information available with a few mouse clicks at the computer.

Let's begin at the homepage, www.lionsclubs.org, where we can see Lions programs presented for the general public. Right under the Lions logo, there is a gold bar with some menu choices, one being the “Member Center”. A click on that link takes us to a page with a blue bar and more choices, including “Planning Projects” and “Managing a Club,” among others. I want to call your attention to the item “Resources.” Following that link takes us to the “Resources” page where you'll notice at the right-hand side a column headed “Helpful Tools.” Here we will find the “Club Resource Center,” “District Resource Center,” and the Leadership Resource Center.”

On the “Club Resources Center” page, we find information in the left-hand column about communicating activities, strengthening membership, sponsoring a LEO Club, finance, building a club Web site at the e-Clubhouse and

club rebuilding. In the center of the page are found four items with a + sign in front of each of them. A click on the + sign will expand a list of choices. For instance, expanding “Club Officers” displays a list with more + signs which will again expand to reveal more topics. Let's click on “Manuals and Guides” and we'll see a list of documents and forms including the Standard Club Constitution and By-Laws, Club Officers Manual, a reference guide for filing the WMMR reports on-line, Club Election Guidelines and much more. A simple mouse-click on any of these will open the document or form, often in the form of a PDF document which can be downloaded and printed or viewed.

I would encourage all Lions to go exploring. This truly is a valuable resource to all of us as Lions.

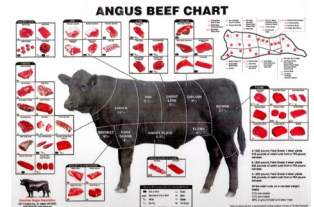
